2. Man by Grace - The Divine Compassion Objects of His Wrath, v.4 - But God, out of the Great love with which He loved us had mercy upon us.

#### United in Christ Ch.2:11-22 (RSV)

<sup>11</sup> Therefore remember that at one time you Gentiles in the flesh, called the uncircumcision by what is called the circumcision, which is made in the flesh by hands— 12 remember that you were at that time separated from Christ, alienated from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world.


13 But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near in the blood of Christ. 14 For He is our peace, who has made us both one, and has broken down the dividing wall of hostility, 15 by abolishing in His flesh the law of commandments and ordinances, that He might create in Himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, 16 and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby bringing the hostility to an end.


## Gentiles have a Double Alienation: from God & from God's people

# The standing symbol represented in the Temple in Jerusalem


#### PLAN VIEW OF THE TEMPLE


